SHOWCASING OUR SITES Albany Bulk Handling



Our Albany Bulk Handling (ABH) site is a joint venture with our Group and is located in southern WA. The site has been operating since 2001 providing these main services:

- Receiving and stockpiling wood chips.
- Stockpile management.
- Sampling and testing wood chips to the Technical Association of Pulp and Paper Industry (TAPPI) standard.
- Reclaiming of woodchips that are exported to China and Japan.

ABH's team comprises nine employees and is led by Business, Operation and Maintenance Manager, Jason Cordon. Jason has worked at the site since its establishment.

Currently, ABH receives four trains a day, four days per week. The current trains delivering woodchips are run by Aurizon and are contracted by our customer Albany Plantation Export Company (APEC). Each of these trains have 15 wagons and make an average delivery of 675 tonne per train, which take around one hour to unload. This means the average delivery of wood chips each week is 10,800 tonne.

"We all want to go home to our families at the end of each day so we need to be aware and look out for our mates, we must do whatever we need to do to eliminate and/or control hazards," said Jason.

"Within our workplace there can be numerous risks and hazards, so by applying effective leadership, utilising the appropriate controls and procedures, empowering our workforce and staying vigilant, we can eliminate injuries.

"Everyone must be 100% alert and on the ball at all times."

GeelongPort recently held its inaugural Reconciliation Working Group with Corrina Eccles from the Wadawurrung Traditional Owners group. To formalise a commitment to a deeper understanding of Wadawarrung people, history and culture, they are currently drafting their first Reconciliation Action Plan.

This milestone provided an opportunity for GeelongPort to reflect on their work as a commercial port for more than 150 years, to strengthen relationships and enhance respect for Traditional Owners not only in the local area but across the nation. More importantly, it allowed them to reflect on and consider what they would like the future to look like and how they can take active steps in supporting the reconciliation process and forge stronger, more collaborative, and profoundly inclusive communities for the betterment of humanity.

The soon to be published Reconciliation Action Plan signals a formal commitment to the reconciliation journey and our people at GeelongPort look forward to listening, sharing, and working together with the local Wadawurrung Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation during its implementation.


