Getting to know...
Business/Operations and
Maintenance Manager

Jason Cordon



How long have you been with LINX Cargo Care Group?

I have been with Albany Bulk Handling (LINX CCG joint venture in WA) working as a contractor since 2001 and was then transferred to a LINX CCG permanent employee in 2004.

What does a typical day at work look like for you?

As the Business/Operations and Maintenance Manager, my day involves maintenance and operational planning, rosters, contractor and safety management, customer meetings and managing the team.

What were you doing prior to joining LINX CCG?

I ran my own electrical business.

Before working at LINX CCG what was the most unusual or interesting job you've ever had?

After finishing my electrical apprenticeship, I found work on inland exploration drill rigs. Our swings were eight weeks on and one week off, usually it was just three blokes in the middle of nowhere doing 12-hour days, seven days a week. We'd make all our meals and do all our own washing and cleaning while living in a dumpy old caravan.





How has your professional development grown in your role?

In 2000 I started as an electrical contractor, then progressed to electrical/maintenance contractor (where I used to come in on the weekends and clean the facility with a broom and wheelbarrow before we had wash down facilities installed) to full time electrician, then Maintenance Supervisor/Manager. After completing my diploma in business management, I was offered the business manger role and have been looking after the site and our people since.

What is a fun fact about yourself that many people may not know?

I was awarded the Australian Governor General's Bravery Medal for saving a very close friend of mine's life in a boating accident.







C3 NZ mobile conveyor back in action







First commissioned in 2014, C3 NZ's Transport team's mobile conveyor has undergone a comprehensive refurbishment over the last six months. The team is delighted to have the mobile conveyor back in action, providing an efficient and environmentally friendly solution for our customer, Ballance Agri-Nutrients.

The mobile conveyor is a Superior Razortail with a fold-up drive over grid and a 50 metre extendable telestaker, capable of handling 1,000 tonne per hour. Currently handling various fertilisers for our customer, the mobile conveyor has previously also been used for wood pellets.

When used to reload a ship, the conveyor eliminates the need to drop bulk fertiliser/product directly on the berth preventing the potential for the product to wash into the sea during wet weather.

It is great to see the mobile conveyor operating again, ensuring our Transport team continues to deliver great service for our customers.
