Australian update

We are pleased to see booster rates increasing, Covid case numbers stabilising or declining in many of our states and government restrictions easing in a number of states. New Zealand update

New Zealand has entered Phase 3 of the Omicron response as daily case numbers are increasing and are expected to rise sharply over the coming weeks.

Key changes include:

- •The move to Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) as the primary form of diagnostic and surveillance testing.
- •Isolation requirements of 10 days only for confirmed cases and their household contacts.

To ensure critical supply chains are maintained, the "critical worker exemption scheme" has been introduced. C3 and Pedersen Group form part of this supply chain and this scheme applies to the vast majority of our operational teams. It enables those who are a household contact of a confirmed positive Covid case (and have a negative RAT result prior to each shift) to continue working. This scheme applies to team members who are fully vaccinated and are asymptomatic only.

We will continue to follow established Covid protocols and provide regular updates to our teams.
